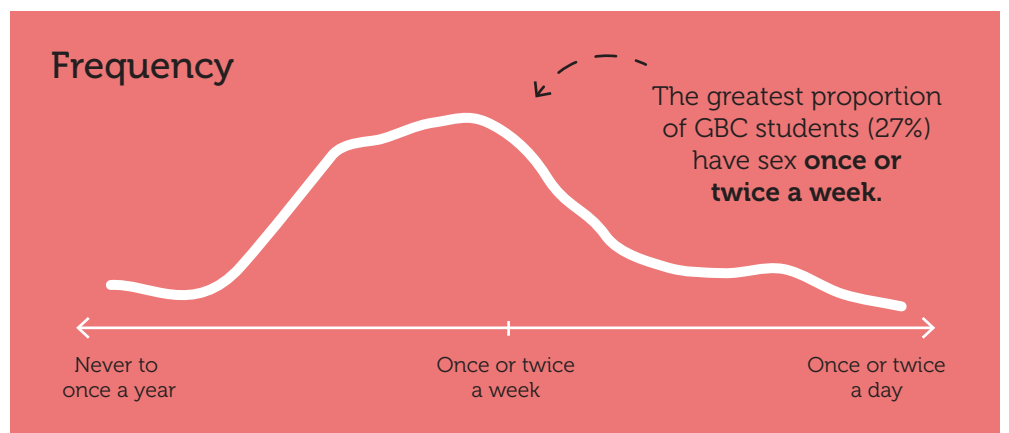


LOVE & SEX SURVEY

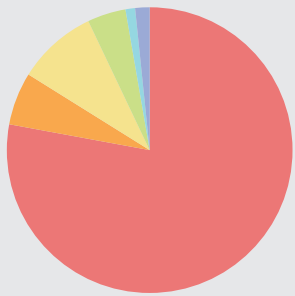
564 George Brown students spilled the beans on their sex lives in our 2015 Love and Sex survey. Here are some of the highlights:



What is "having sex"?

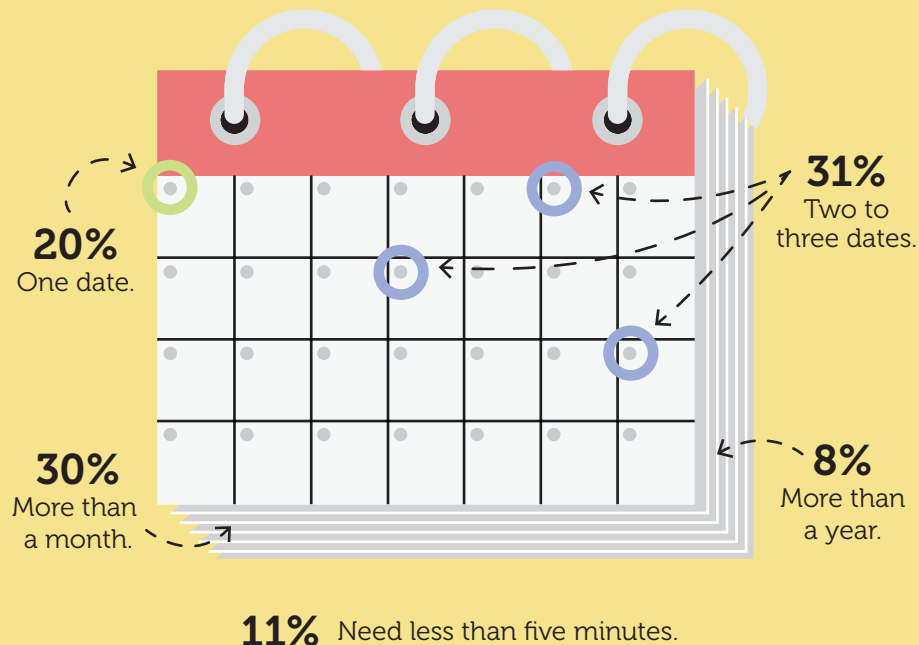
Students are divided on this one: Roughly half define it as vaginal penetration, while the other half define it as anything they wouldn't want their mom to see them doing.

of respondents have been paid for sex or performed other sex work.

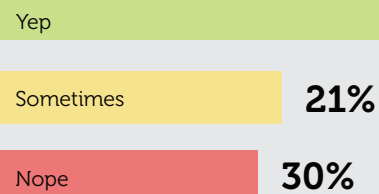
40%

31%

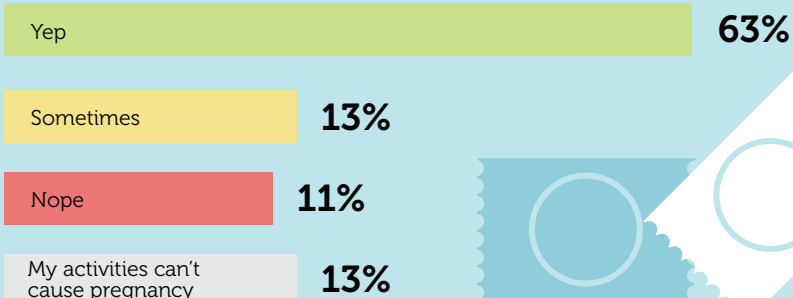
of students admit to cheating on their partner.

Do you use anything to prevent STIs?

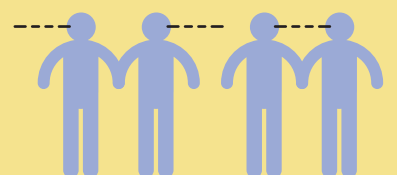


While there is room for improvement, overall use of protection has paid off: **84% of students report that they have never had an STI.**
